



PRIVACY AND DATA PROTECTION STATEMENT

Childhood Cancer Ireland

Childhood Cancer Ireland is committed to protecting your privacy and developing technology that gives you the most powerful and safe online experience. This Statement of Privacy applies to the Childhood Cancer Ireland website and governs data collection and usage under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

By using the Childhood Cancer Ireland website, you consent to the data practices described in this statement.

Collection of your Personal Information

Childhood Cancer Ireland collects personally identifiable information, such as your e-mail address, name, home or work address or telephone number. Childhood Cancer Ireland also collects anonymous demographic information, which is not unique to you, such as your location, age, gender, preferences, interests and favourites.

There is also information about your computer hardware and software that is automatically collected by Childhood Cancer Ireland. This information can include: your IP address, browser type, domain names, access times and referring Website addresses. This information is used by Childhood Cancer Ireland for the operation of the service, to maintain quality of the service, and to provide general statistics regarding use of the Childhood Cancer Ireland website.

Please keep in mind that if you directly disclose personally identifiable information or personally sensitive data through Childhood Cancer Ireland public message boards, this information may be collected and used by others.

Note: Childhood Cancer Ireland does not read any of your private online communications. Childhood Cancer Ireland encourages you to review the privacy statements of websites you choose to link to from Childhood Cancer Ireland so that you can understand how those websites collect, use and share your information. Childhood Cancer Ireland is not responsible for the privacy statements or other content on Websites outside of the Childhood Cancer Ireland and Childhood Cancer Ireland family of Websites.

Use of your Personal Information

Childhood Cancer Ireland collects and uses your personal information to operate the Childhood Cancer Ireland Website and deliver the services you have requested. Childhood Cancer Ireland also uses your personally identifiable information to inform you of other products or services available from Childhood

Cancer Ireland and its affiliates. Childhood Cancer Ireland may also contact you via surveys to conduct research about your opinion of current services or of potential new services that may be offered.

Childhood Cancer Ireland does not sell, rent or lease its customer lists to third parties. Childhood Cancer Ireland may, from time to time, contact you on behalf of external business partners about a particular offering that may be of interest to you. In those cases, your unique personally identifiable information (e-mail, name, address, telephone number) is not transferred to the third party. In addition, Childhood Cancer Ireland may share data with trusted partners to help us perform statistical analysis, send you email or postal mail, provide customer support, or arrange for deliveries. All such third parties are prohibited from using your personal information except to provide these services to Childhood Cancer Ireland, and they are required to maintain the confidentiality of your information.

Childhood Cancer Ireland does not use or disclose sensitive personal information, such as race, religion, or political affiliations, without your explicit consent. Childhood Cancer Ireland keeps track of the Websites and pages our customers visit within Childhood Cancer Ireland, in order to determine what Childhood Cancer Ireland services are the most popular. This data is used to deliver customized content and advertising within Childhood Cancer Ireland to customers whose behaviour indicates that they are interested in a particular subject area.

Childhood Cancer Ireland Websites will disclose your personal information, without notice, only if required to do so by law or in the good faith belief that such action is necessary to:

- (a) conform to the edicts of the law or comply with legal process served on Childhood Cancer Ireland or the site;
- (b) protect and defend the rights or property of Childhood Cancer Ireland; and,
- (c) act under exigent circumstances to protect the personal safety of users of Childhood Cancer Ireland, or the public.

Use of Cookies

The Childhood Cancer Ireland Website use "cookies" to help you personalize your online experience. A cookie is a text file that is placed on your hard disk by a Web page server. Cookies cannot be used to run programs or deliver viruses to your computer. Cookies are uniquely assigned to you, and can only be read by a web server in the domain that issued the cookie to you. One of the primary purposes of cookies is to provide a convenience feature to save you time. The purpose of a cookie is to tell the Web server that you have returned to a specific page. For example, if you personalize Childhood Cancer Ireland pages, or register with Childhood Cancer Ireland site or services, a cookie helps Childhood Cancer Ireland to recall your specific information on subsequent visits.

This simplifies the process of recording your personal information, such as billing addresses, shipping addresses, and so on. When you return to the same Childhood Cancer Ireland Website, the information you previously provided can be retrieved, so you can easily use the Childhood Cancer Ireland features that you customized. You have the ability to accept or decline cookies. Most Web browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can usually modify your browser setting to decline cookies if you prefer. If you choose to decline cookies, you may not be able to fully experience the interactive features of the Childhood Cancer Ireland services or Websites you visit.

Security of your Personal Information

Childhood Cancer Ireland secures your personal information from unauthorized access, use or disclosure. Childhood Cancer Ireland secures the personally identifiable information you provide on computer servers in a controlled, secure environment, protected from unauthorized access, use or disclosure. When personal information (such as a credit card number) is transmitted to other Websites, it is protected through the use of encryption, such as the Secure Socket Layer (SSL) protocol. Changes to this Statement Childhood Cancer Ireland will occasionally update this Statement of Privacy to reflect company and customer feedback. Childhood Cancer Ireland encourages you to periodically review this Statement to be informed of how Childhood Cancer Ireland is protecting your information.
